PERKINS RARE BOOK COLLECTION

FISHER FINE ARTS LIBRARY BUILT
The Library was built by the New York Architectural Terra Cotta Company in 1886-1893. The lead architect was Frank Furness, and builder William R. Chapman & Sons, and designer Joseph M. Huston.

GALLERY IN REFERENCE READING ROOM
A gallery was added in the Reference reading room by Frank Furness and Evans & Co.

STORY DURRING MEMORIAL STACKS
A 5-story addition was made for the Dilling Memorial Stacks by Frank Furness and Evans & Co.

NEW FLOOR WITHIN MAIN READING ROOM
A new floor was inserted within the main reading room by Frank Furness and Evans & Co.

TWO STORY HENRY CHARLES LEA LIBRARY AND READING ROOM ADDED
A new library and reading room were added by Frank Furness and Evans & Co.

STUDY OF PROVISION FOR MORE SPACE
A study was done by Paul Philippe Cret and Weston Powers Laird for additional space.

ONE STORY HORACE HOWARD FURNNESS MEMORIAL LIBRARY ADDED TO FRONT OF BOOK STACK; CONVERTED TO ARTHUR ROSS GALLERY IN 1980S
Another library was added in by the architect Robert Rodes MacGowen.

1920S READING ROOM FLOOR REMOVED, BOOK STACK STRUCTURE REPLACED
The reading room floor was removed and stacks replaced by Rauch Venturi and Scott Brown.

FISHER FINE ARTS LIBRARY
The Fisher Fine Arts Library supports study, teaching and research in contemporary and historical aspects of art, architecture, city and regional planning, historic preservation, landscape architecture, studio art, and urban design. Text and image collections, in analog and digital form, have a global reach and concentrate on the arts of the western experience, Islam, South Asia and East Asia, from prehistory to the present. Our digital and print resources are designed to meet the needs of students and faculty of the departments, schools and programs of the University of Pennsylvania.

NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK
The University of Pennsylvania's first library building was designed by Frank Furness (pronounced "furnace"), in consultation with library authorities Melvil Dewey and Justin Winsor. The collaboration produced a technologically advanced and utilitarian facility which, thanks to Furness's flamboyant style, was anything but mundane. The cornerstone was laid in October 1888, and the University of Pennsylvania Library was formally dedicated on February 7, 1891. The window mottos and other inscriptions in the building were chosen by Horace Howard Furness (Frank's older brother), a Shakespearean scholar and prominent member of Penn's faculty in the late nineteenth century. Though destined to accommodate decades of collection expansion as projected in the 1880s, the building already was becoming crowded by the first decade of the twentieth century. Over the next thirty years, several major alterations and additions were made to accommodate heavier-than-expected use and to house various special collections, including the Horace Howard Furness Memorial Library, and the Henry Charles Lea Library in 1962, the main and special library collections moved to the newly-constructed Van Pelt Library.

ARTHUR ROSS GALLERY
On February 18, 1985, the Arthur Ross Gallery opened its doors to the public with the exhibition Francisco Goya y Lucientes: The Drawings of the War of Independence. Spanish Entrepreneur and art collector Arthur Ross, and the Arthur Ross Foundation, two years earlier, gave the University of Pennsylvania \$10 million to establish the Arthur Ross Foundation, and a gallery in the University of Pennsylvania. Under collector Arthur Ross and the inspired vision to establish an art gallery in the University of Pennsylvania, Under President Martin S. Moyer, the Arthur Ross Gallery took shape. It continues to be housed in the Fisher Fine Arts Library building, designed by Frank Furness.

PERKINS RARE BOOK COLLECTION
The Fisher Fine Arts Library is a collection of monuments of architectural publishing. It is located on the main level of the Fisher Fine Arts Library and holds approximately three thousand rare books as well as drawings and historic maps. The foundation of the collection is the single great book of Vitruvius Pollio (ca. 90-20 BCE) together with works by the five figures from the Renaissance period: Alberti, Scamozzi, Serlio, Vignola, and Palladio. The original collection was established in 1965 by G. Holmes Perkins who served as Dean of Penn's Graduate School of Fine Arts (as it was then) from 1951 to 1971.






PolyAurum has developed proprietary gold nanoparticles which increase the radiation dose selectively to a tumor, but not the healthy tissue surrounding the tumor. This improves the effectiveness of radiotherapy without the dose limiting side effects seen with traditional radiotherapy.

ProNoto



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ProNoto helps physicians earn professionally required educational credits while remaining current through the use of a recording and organizing application. **ProNoto** helps physicians: 1) earn credit for everyday, clinically relevant reading and resource review, 2) record and save already credited CME, 3) creates a tailored reminder system to keep physicians on their desired path, and 4) suggests articles/institutional updates for review.

IDENTIFYING MARKET OFFICIALS AND ATTRACTING NEWCOMERS




The Food Trust distributes Friend Reward Coupons to "ambassadors," existing farmers' market patrons and partner organizations.
